



IS DUBBED THE SET EVER SAFETY CAMPAIGN IN PMC HISTORY Concentrator Refined Hawks

Palabora Mining Company teams embarked on a 12-month Zero Harm Cup Safety Campaign aimed at fighting against the 15 fatal risk protocols identified within its operations and WON.

The Zero Harm Cup is dubbed the best ever Safety Campaign in PMC history. The teams' collaborative embodiment of the Zero Harm Cup strategy allowed them to jointly SLAP hazards and win (Stop, Look, Assess, Protect). Many of the prior safety strategies #See Something, Say Something, and Save Someone, #Khumb'lekhaya etc., were all effective, but the #PMC

ZERO harm Cup campaign called for mindset culture change, wholistic team interaction, ethical leadership, clear communication, and individual accountability to grow and commitment to continuously learn.

The Zero Harm Cup campaign was a great success! Its impact is measurable in the mindset change of employees, harmonious operations, and stellar safety performance recording only 5 LTIs at the close of the year 2023.

PMC is now an even safer mine! The continuous self-assessments and audits conducted during the matches of the campaign capacitated the workforce,

elevated their understanding of standards, bridged the gaps of nonconformances and intensified a safety conscious culture. Individual accountabilities improved and everyone LEARNED how to interact with the fatal hazards by ensuring controls are implemented to prevent accidents. Knowledge is POWER and the learning that took place during this campaign is something that will for years to come continue to contribute towards SAFE PRODUCTION at PMC.

12-months down the line the most prevalent (or common across the operation) fatal risk protocols were engaged with in matches and beaten.

Only 2 teams remain standing in the challenge.

The Refined Hawks and the TFP & CFP Concentrator Team anxiously await the announcement of the 2023 ZERO HARM CUP winners at the award ceremony on 12 March 2024.

In closing, the truth is, although we are proud of the finalists, we are equally proud of all the teams that participated. All the teams that have changed their way of thinking.

All the teams that can now identify and control operational hazards.
